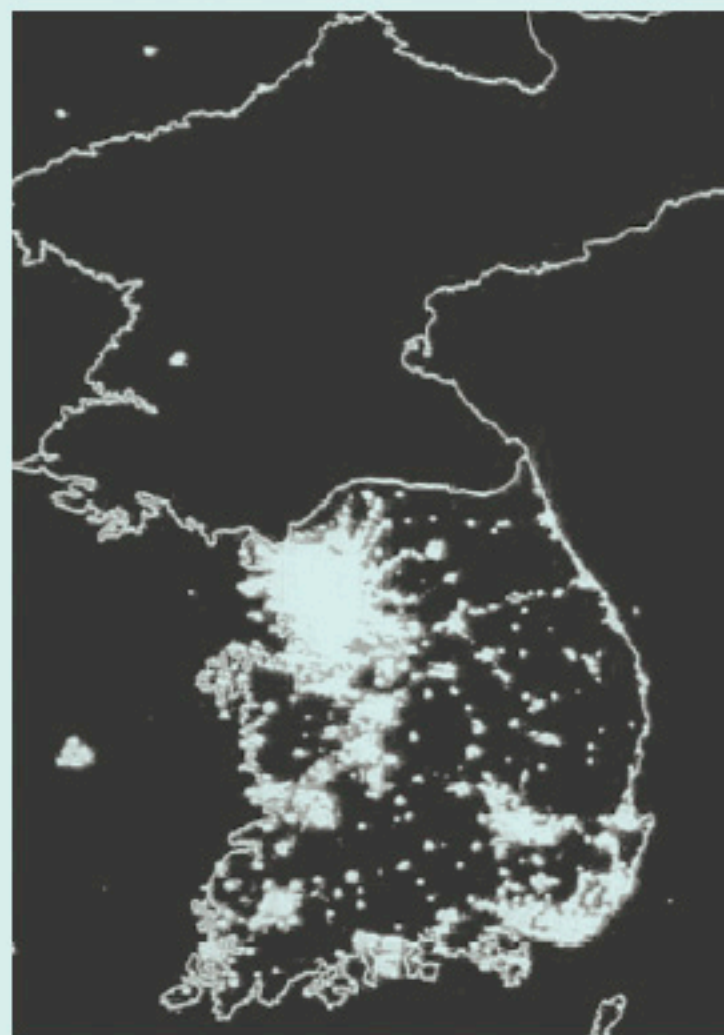


EVEN A SATELLITE CAN SEE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DARKNESS AND FREEDOM.
